CAMP RAINBOW

Camp Rainbow is a five-day camp dedicated to pediatric cancer patients and survivors between the ages of 6-17 in Mississippi. The camp is located in Utica, Mississippi and has been operating nonprofit for thirty years. Camp Rainbow is in close relation to Blair E. Batson Children's Cancer Center, and the nurses and doctors volunteer their time at the camp so children who are currently going through chemotherapy can still enjoy the activities of camp. Camp Rainbow is also staffed by the Cancer Center's Pediatric Oncology Social Worker, a familiar face to many of the kids.

The positive impact that camp has upon the kids is everlasting. Children who will never be able to walk can fly among the trees on a zip line or swing through the sky on the ropes course. Camp offers kids five days of normalcy and an opportunity to connect with others who have experienced the same circumstances. Past campers often come back to volunteer as counselors and to strengthen the friendships they've made in the past. Camp may only be a few days, but the memories made and the confidence the kids will experience lasts forever.

Camp activities include the following: archery, fishing, swimming, arts and crafts, canoeing, dance party, talent night, movie night, field day, redneck slipping slide, a memorial service, fireworks and various other activities.



OPERATING EXPENSES

In the 30 years since its opening, Camp Rainbow has been offered to the children at no charge. However, there are extreme operating expenses that must be met for Camp Rainbow to continue providing these wonderful experiences.

Facts about Camp Rainbow

- Approximately 90 children attend each year.
- 40 volunteers give their time to the campers.
- Batson Hospital Doctors and Nurses volunteer each year to help with camp.
- \$40,000 is needed to fund 5 days of camp.
 - \$500 is the expense per camper.
- Transportation is needed for some of the campers to be able to attend camp.
- Camp serves 15 meals to approximately 130 people throughout the week.
 - 260 snacks are provided per day to campers and staff.
- Camp operates completely off of donations.
- Both Monetary and Supply donations are needed to continue Camp Rainbow for the children.
- Financial obligations and goals must be met by: **May 1** for camp to take place.

(Any excess funds will go towards funding camp in the future)

SUPPLY LIST

Cabin Supplies (14 cabins)

- Rolls of paper towels
- Rolls of toilet paper
- Liquid hand soap
 - GermX
- Large trash bags
- Case of Lysol spray
- Tubes of Lysol wipes
- Cans of spray on Sunscreen, 50+ or higher SPF
 - Rub in Sunscreen, 50+ or higher SPF
- Cans of long reaching, flying bug killer for wasps, hornets, etc...
 - Fly swatter

All around Camp Supplies:

- Paper towels
- Concentrated Gatorade
- Small cups, paper or plastic for Gatorade
 - GermX
 - Lysol Wipes
- Batteries (AA, C, D) these are used for flashlights, walkie talkies, radios, etc...

Pool:

- Pool blow up toys: balls, rings, arm floaties, etc...
- Spray on Sunscreen, 50+ or higher SPF.
- Rub in sunscreen, 50+ or higher SPF
- Small air pump for pool toys
- Goggles (Kids & Adults)

Infirmary:

- For kids who get sick throughout the week.
- Small cans of Sprite
 - Individual Snacks
 - Over the counter medications
 - First Aid supplies
